Every year, over \$1 billion in public funds is allocated to improve LA's streets and public spaces. However, the current system is broken, failing to deliver the services communities truly deserve. There's no clear vision or prioritized project list for our streets and sidewalks, leading to an inequitable distribution of resources.

Our Vision:
